Millet History

The Canadian Pacific Railway from Calgary to Edmonton was completed in 1891. At that time Ben Slaughter, a fur trader and buyer, had a store where Millet is now located. Sir William Van Horne, president of the Pacific Railway Company, asked Father Lacombe to give names of all the stations between Lacombe and Edmonton. Father Lacombe submitted a list, which was approved by the Lieutenant Governor of the North West territories. In honor of August Millet, a fur buyer who sold furs to Ben Slaughter and was a canoe man for Father Lacombe, on



June 17, 1903, Millet was proclaimed a Village by an Order-in-Council. By 1908, Millet's first councilors were elected.

The first post office was established in 1896 on April 1 and Ben Slaughter was the first postmaster. In 1903 Van Meter and Jack West built stores in Millet the same year Millet became a Village. Jim Blades was the first overseer. P.J. Mullen settles in the Millet area in 1899. He was an entrepreneur who attracted many settlers to the area by extensive advertising of the possibilities for success here. New businesses were established and thrived. By 1915, the Board of Trade had fifty members from Millet and area. The one room school built on the east side of the tracks in 1901, was destroyed by fire and in 1902 was replaced by a two-room school, then by a four room school in 1930 to accommodate grades one to twelve.

In October 1927, a disastrous fire destroyed many of the buildings along the east side of Railway Street, but the businessmen rebuilt across the street.

In 1950, the Board of Trade built a Community Hall, which the Board gave to the Village and is still being used today. In 1953, Northwestern Utilities brought natural gas to the Village.

In the mid-seventies housing development started in Millet and was followed by and influx of new residents. Acreage developments surrounding Millet took place as well. In 1981, the Griffiths-Scott School was built; between it and the Millet School students from grades one to nine from Millet and the area were accommodated.

On September 1, 1983, Millet was declared a Town and October 17, 1983, a General Election was held with the change to Town status, 6 Councilors and a Mayor were elected. As the town continues to become a home to more people, its business community is steadily becoming revitalized. It can be proud of its excellent facilities, with the future looking very promising

The Guaranteed Income Supplement (GIS) provides a monthly non-taxable benefit to Old Age Security (OAS) pension recipients who have a low income and are living in Canada.

You qualify for the Guaranteed Income Supplement if you meet all of the following conditions:

- you are receiving an Old Age Security pension
- your annual income (or in the case of a couple, your combined income) is lower than the maximum annual threshold.

The Alberta Aids to Daily Living (AADL) program helps Albertans with a long-term disability, chronic illness or terminal illness maintain their independence in their community through the provision of medical equipment and supplies to meet their basic, medically assessed needs.

Who is eligible? You may be eligible if you: are a resident of Alberta; hold a valid and active Alberta Personal Health Card; and require assistance because of a long-term disability, chronic illness or terminal illness. You must be assessed by an AADL Authorizer or Specialty Supplier.

Being "down in the dumps" over a period of time is NOT a normal part of growing old but is a common problem. Feeling this way can affect your body, mood and thoughts. It can affect the way you eat and sleep, your self-concept and it's not the same as a passing blue mood. It is not a sign of personal weakness or a feeling that can be willed or wished away. Help is available through your family doctor and after a complete examination your doctor may suggest you talk to a Mental Health Worker. FRAUDS & SCAMS

On a daily basis, criminals are taking advantage of people. Although many legitimate businesses market their products and services over the telephone, door to door, through the Internet, through the mail or through newspaper and magazine ads, there are unscrupulous people who will also use these methods to take your money. Learn how to tell the difference between a legitimate and honest offer and those individuals that could be defrauding you.

PROTECT YOURSELF FROM FRAUDS & SCAMS BY:

- * Taking your time! Don't be pressured into making an immediate decision. Take time to ask family, a friend or someone you trust before making a deal you're not comfortable with.
 - * Never give your credit card number or bank account information to people calling over the phone and don't ever send money by messenger or overnight mail.
 - * Call PhoneBusters at **1-888-495-8501** or the website at **www.phonebusters.com** or call Alberta Government Consumer Information Centre at **1-877-427-4088**, if the offer sounds too good to be true.
 - * Never buy something because there is a FREE GIFT.
 - * If you feel uncomfortable or pressured by the caller, HANG UP.
 - * Always remember, if it sounds too good to be true, it usually is.
 - * Watch out for people asking you for "shipping & handling" fees or to pay a "small gift tax" in order to receive a prize. Legitimate contests won't ask you to send money to receive a prize.

HOMEOWNERS BEWARE:

Home-repair frauds are occurring more frequently!!

- * Avoid contractors who knock on your door and claim they are doing work in the area and offer you a "special price" for repairs they feel your home needs.
- * Be wary of contractors who promise you a discount for work done if you agree to allow them to use your home to "advertise" their work.
 - * Be cautious of contractors who quote a price without seeing what needs to be repaired.
 - * Be wary of contractors who demand a large down payment to buy materials.
 - * Be cautious of contractors who offer to conduct a free inspection of your home and then suggest major repairs.

Before hiring a contractor, have the individual provide you with the following:

* Municipal business license

* GST Number

* Workers' compensation account number

* Provincial prepaid contractor's license number

REMEMBER: Legitimate businesses are not concerned about you checking past customer relationships, and are willing to wait for you to decide to use their services. If they are reluctant to give you any information, you should be just as reluctant to hire them. You should always shop around – get more than one price and compare. If you suspect a fraud or scam report it immediately to your local RCMP detachment at **780-312-7267.**

ELDER ABUSE

Elder abuse is generally described as any action or lack of action that causes harm to an elderly person. Elder abuse takes many forms:

- * Physical abuse slapping, pushing, kicking, punching, deliberate exposure to severe weather, inappropriate use of medication or unnecessary restraint
- * Sexual abuse
- * Psychological abuse humiliation, isolation, intimidation, threats, inappropriate control of activities or removal of decision-making power when the elderly person is still capable of making decisions
- * Financial abuse

GARDENS AND WALKING TRAILS

Millet is centered on a **65-acre park system** with a combination of natural and manicured areas, Pipestone Creek and Eyot Creek with multi-use lighted and paved pathways (utilized year round), trails, and include facilities such as the Agriplex (a multi-use facility), Ball diamonds, Soccer fields, and Splash Pad.

Millet Memory Rose Garden is situated along Hwy 2A and was constructed in 1998.Rose bushes purchased are in memory of a loved one. There is variety of species and color. Completing the area is park benches and a Gazebo sponsored by the Millet Chamber of Commerce and maintained by Millet in Bloom.

The Burns Creamery Garden, constructed and designed after the original Creamery Garden. This perennial garden along Hwy 2A was a project of Communities In Bloom volunteers and started with perennials donated from the community. As a heritage site the museum added a plaque to tell the story of the creamery and its garden.

Bell Kiosk Garden Located at the north end of Millet along Hwy 2A this beautiful garden area is in a park like setting. The kiosk holds the first school bell in Millet and tells the story of the school including a mural of the interior of the school. The gardens in front frame the divided brick pathway leading to the kiosk. There are annuals, perennials and small shrubs displaying color and variety. Surrounding this are grassed areas, tall trees, park bench, picnic table, shrub bed and another flower bed.

Irish Garden designed and built by Communities In Bloom volunteers to honor their partnership at the international level with Warringstown, Northern Ireland. This shamrock shaped garden has a rainbow shaped planter in the center with a pot of gold (marigolds) at the base. At the back of the garden perennials are climbing one of the light poles of the outdoor rink located on 50th Avenue.

PUTTING YOUR AFFAIRS IN ORDER

WILLS AND ESTATES

A will is a written document that allows you to set out how your property is to be distributed after you die. A will allows you to name a person who will act as your executor after your death and who will make certain that your property is distributed according to your wishes. A will does not have any legal force or effect until after you die. There are two types of wills: - A formal will: prepared for you by a lawyer - A holograph will: prepared by you and done in your handwriting What happens if you die without a will? If you die without a will, your property will be distributed according to the provisions of the Intestate Succession Act. Information about this act is available in the handbook "Saying Farewell: A helpful guide with information and forms to assist you through the death and dying process". In the first days and weeks after losing a loved one, there is a long list of calls the survivor needs to make, preferably by working closely with the executor of the estate. A careful reading of this list serves as a guide to help you put your affairs in order to make things much easier during a difficult time.

In person assistance is available by appointment only. - Includes Old Age Security, Guaranteed Income Supplement, Allowance for the Survivor, Canada Pension Plan (Retirement Pension, Disability Pension, Survivor's Benefit and Death Benefit.) - Give the name and Social Insurance Number of the deceased and make arrangements to take in the senior's Blue Card and other pension identification to be cancelled. - Pension payments for the month of death are paid to the estate. - See note under "Banks" (page 28) regarding cheques deposited directly to the bank account.

This is particularly important if the person has been receiving GST credits. - After completing the final income tax return, complete the form requesting a Certificate of Clearance to wind up their account with this department. - The survivor will have to file an income tax return for the year of death for the deceased. - If there is income from the other sources, pro-rate it to the date of death. - It is strongly advised that an accountant's help be obtained, particularly if the estate is considerable, as the estate will pay the cost for the survivor's income tax return.

Insurance

If you are not able to identify the source company of an insurance policy or cannot find the policy(s) of the deceased, contact the Canadian Life and Health Insurance OmbudService and have them do a policy search to locate potential life insurance coverage that may have been misplaced over time. Funeral and costs

Check to see if the deceased has made pre-arrangements. If not, decide on time and place of the funeral or memorial service. To arrange a plot in the Millet or Catholic Cemetery, please contact the Town of Millet at 780-387-4554.

Credit cards

These should be cancelled with the credit card issuers and the cards should be destroyed unless they are in the survivor's name as well.

Banks/safety deposit boxes

The bank will require a copy of the will and the funeral director's death certificate. If cheques were deposited directly into a bank account, the issuer may not have the correct address of the deceased and must be apprised of the person's death.

Be prepared to stay on the line, you will be advised on how to care for the patient prior to the ambulance arrival.
