Robyn Bickford stated she also agreed a 2-week extension was justified. She also stated that she felt that Council needed to find other ways to get this information to the residents, she stated she did not know the answer but would try and find other avenues to suggest.

Assistant C.A.O. Lisa Schoening read a letter submitted by Craig Rudolph, as he was unable to attend. The letter stated he was a taxpayer and business owner and felt that this delay in giving effect to this new bylaw was hurting chances of new business coming to town. He stated that there has been ample time, 14 months, for residents to review the document and that a small minority of people with no vested interest in the outcome should not be allowed to delay or cause this much expense to taxpayers.
