MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

The promise of Spring is just around the corner and with that comes a sense of optimism in looking forward to what is to come in the months ahead. How true this will be this year for those who call Millet home!

Firstly, a new business moves into the Millet Industrial Park this month. SATO Canada will operate their new oilfield transportation training school on site in our Industrial Park where they will specialize in training vacuum truck and water truck haulers.

I am beyond pleased to advise that Council and Administration are working diligently with the developer of the Lakeside Meadows residential development and we hope to see some physical construction of homes start there this Spring! I personally feel this development is a huge asset to our community and will work to ensure that we do all we can to move this project forward as soon as possible.

Later on, at the end of April, our Library is moving into their newly refurbished and expanded space in the old Millet School Building. This move will greatly expand and enhance our library facility and, from what I hear, patrons of all ages are very excited about this and cannot wait to have a look at and enjoy our new facility!

After the library moves out of its current location, the new owners will begin renovating the premises for their Bluebird Daycare and After School Childcare Service. Our Town has been without a major childcare facility for a number of years and this new facility – which will be opening in time for the 2021/22 school year – will fill a huge void for many young families in town.

Other Town projects that will be reaching completion in the summer months are the new Town Administration Office and the new Community Hall facility. These will be opening up in the refurbished old Millet School Building in July. Also, the ice surface at the Agriplex will be ready to go in September. All of these projects are proceeding smoothly and will be completed on schedule.

Lastly, and on a personal note, some of you will know that I underwent some surgery just before Christmas late last year. I am happy to report that all went well and I am now back attending to my mayoral duties on a daily and as-needed basis. I want to say a big Thank You to all of you who extended good wishes to me for a speedy recovery.

Millet in Bloom (MiB) March / April 2021


