11.2 Request for Utility Connection Agreement

#### BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL

Earlier this year the well providing water service to 5104-52 St failed and in accordance with the Town of Millet Bylaw 2022-02 being the Water and Sewer Regulations Section 7, the property owner Ms. Taylor was required to connect to the Town's water distribution system.

#### DISCUSSION/OPTIONS/BENEFITS/DISADVANTAGES

The cost for the water connection was unplanned, and the cost significant. As the Town's bylaws limit options available the Ms. Taylor, she has requested that Council provide her with the opportunity to have the total charges placed on her tax roll over a three-year period.

#### COSTS/SOURCE OF FUNDING

The total amount including the off-site levies is \$9,473.50 which is \$3,157.84 per year for three years.

#### **RECOMMENDED ACTION:**

That Council authorize administration to enter into a utility connection agreement with the owner of 5104 - 52 Street being tax roll 25500 to have the cost of the connection to the Town's water distribution system paid by the Town and charged back on the tax roll over a three-year period at a total cost of \$9,473.50.
