BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL

Council directed Administration to bring forward options with cost estimates for formalizing a parking area and fencing at Paul Pay soccer field.

DISCUSSION/OPTIONS/BENEFITS/DISADVANTAGES

Fencing

Option 1 - Leave as is, no fencing installation.

- No cost
- Does not define field surface vs parking area
- Less maintenance

Option 2 - Rail fencing – estimated cost \$5,500

- Matches theme identified in Parks and Community Master Plan
- · Ongoing maintenance cost and additional trimming
- Would well define the parking area

Option 3 -Concrete Lego Blocks with chains (reused from splash park area)- \$4,000

- Does not match community theme
- Reused chains are a potential hazard
- Blocks could be repurposed in the future
- Ongoing maintenance costs and additional trimming

Although there was some discussion regarding re-using the existing fencing at the splash park, this is not practical as the posts require maintenance, and the depth and base material is unknown making it financially impractical.

Parking Lot

Option 1 - Leave as is - \$0

- Cost effective
- Add parking signage stating times that parking would be allowed
- Less maintenance
- More unpredictable for users

Option 2 – Formalize gravel parking area - \$10,000 (excluding staff and equipment time)

- More ongoing maintenance
- Expensive
- Better parking surface and aesthetic

COSTS/SOURCE OF FUNDING

See above, none of the options presented with associated costs have been accounted for in the 2024 budget.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

That Administration monitor the parking situation at Paul Pay field for the 2024 soccer season and bring forward a report later in the year for Council's consideration.

11.3 - Highway 2A and Highway 616 Traffic Signalization\

Infrastructure Upgrades

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL

The Town has been working with Alberta Transportation and Economic Corridors (ATEC) for the installation of traffic lights at the intersection of Highway 2A and Highway 616. As ATEC is responsible for three of the four portions of road into the intersection they have agreed to contribute 75% to the project and cover the ongoing maintenance of the traffic lights when installed.

DISCUSSION/OPTIONS/BENEFITS/DISADVANTAGES

The tender for the infrastructure works was posted on Alberta Purchasing Connection February 15, 2024 and closed March 7, 2024. The agreement with ATEC requires that the tender be awarded to the lowest compliant bidder. The bids received are as follows:

There are three components to this project the CPKC railway upgrades, engineering and intersection upgrades.

Component	Cost

Engineering	\$109,861.00
Contracted intersection upgrades	\$504,245.55
Total	\$1,046,144.55

Alberta Transportation Cost Share (75%)	\$784,608.41
Town of Millet Cost Share	\$261,536.14

COSTS/SOURCE OF FUNDING

Council has approved \$250,000 for this project as part of the 2024 capital budget, however there may be changes to the final cost as the numbers provided by CPKC are estimates only and there is no contingency built within the prices provided.

RECOMMENDED ACTION:

That Council accept the tender from Park-Aid Asphalt & Maintenance in the amount of \$504,245.55 plus GST for the Highway 2A and Highway 616 Intersection Upgrades.

That Council approve an additional \$50,000 from Canada Community Building Fund (CCBF) to cover any additional costs associated with the Highway 2A and Highway 616 Traffic Signalization upgrades.
