Agenda Item: Millet In Bloom Memorial Rose Garden Fence Replacement

BACKGROUND/PROPOSAL

Millet In Bloom has requested that Council approve the replacement of the existing wooden fence at the memorial rose garden with a white vinyl picket style fence.

DISCUSSION/OPTIONS/BENEFITS/DISADVANTAGES

The fence proposed by Millet in Bloom is a 3-foot high, picket white vinyl to be placed in the existing location of the wooden fence. Administration has requested the possible relocation of the entrance of the garden as there is a sign pole in the existing walkway as well as a light pole outside the fence near the entrance to the garden.



COSTS/SOURCE OF FUNDING

The cost of the vinyl fence replacement is \$5,750.62 plus GST to be funded through the Millet in Bloom operating budget.

MOTION OPTIONS:

That Council approve the request of Millet In Bloom to replace the fencing at the Memorial Rose Garden with a 3-foot high white vinyl fence in the amount of \$5,750.62 plus GST to be funded through the Millet In Bloom budget.

ALTERNATIVE MOTIONS

1. That Council direct Millet In Bloom to repair the existing fence and maintain the existing service level.
