At the March 26, 2025 Council meeting, Council approved the cost for upgrades to be completed at the Civic Centre playground including the installation of exercise equipment, gazebo and concrete works. After starting the project, it was identified that the pea gravel that was in a portion of the playground area was a safety concern. As well, once the rubber tiles were removed from the area beside the playground equipment it was identified that the edge requires changes as it is raised and cut straight.
